A MESSAGE FROM THE Mayor

(It has been just over a month since Russia attacked Ukraine. I've spent a lot of time thinking about the consequences of the attack and what that will mean for our country and our world.





I've also thought a lot about our city. How we could have let this divide us; let our differing backgrounds tear us apart. But instead, our community rallied behind unity and peace. Our residents stood against the unprovoked attack and supported those fighting, fleeing, and surviving in Ukraine. I am humbled by the actions of our residents and all that they are doing for the people of Ukraine. From peaceful protests in our parks to donations to providing direct aid to refugees, I am reminded why Sunny Isles Beach is such a special place to live.

As you know, there is a strong subset of our population from Eastern Europe, including Ukraine and Russia. News outlets and outsiders have deemed our city "Little Moscow." I'm sure you've seen many articles referencing Sunny Isles Beach as such. But when you are here -on the streets, eating in the restaurants, playing in the parks, at the school- it is apparent that we are so much more than this nickname fruitlessly assigned to us. Sure, we have residents from Ukraine, Russia, Belarus, and Poland. We also have residents from South America, Central America, western Europe, and North America. Our city is many things, but at the core, we are a multicultural, inclusive community that supports one another.

I am blown away by our residents' response to the news of the attack. The generosity and unwavering interest in aiding Ukraine that we are witnessing is inspiring. Families are providing safe places for refugees to live. Our young students are welcoming Ukrainian children, who fled the only home they've known, to their schools with open arms and a helping hand. You are gathering and peacefully protesting for what you believe in.

And the City absolutely supports these efforts. At the March Commission Meeting, we expressed support for the democratic government of Ukraine by adopting a resolution, standing in solidarity with the innocent and peaceful people, and condemning Vladimir Putin's invasion and acts of war. Last month we partnered with Global Empowerment Mission and were able to collect enough provisions, from non-perishable foods to hygiene items to clothing, to fill nearly two SIBshuttle buses. The City also partnered with the Russian American Bar Association of Florida to host two events assisting Ukrainian refugees with the legal process to seek Temporary Protected Status. Our own Chabad Russian Center, led by Rabbi Kaller, is using their network in Ukraine to provide transportation for those of all religious affiliations wishing to evacuate, along with armed security, food and medicine.

I want to wholeheartedly thank everyone who so generously donated and supported the Ukrainian people. If you are interested and have the means, I encourage you to donate to one of a number of non-profits that are providing aid to Ukrainian people. You can find more information on sibfl.net/ukraine.

There is strength in unity. And while we hope and pray that the conflict finds a resolution as soon as possible, I implore our community to continue standing strong together for the people of Ukraine.

Addressing Our Residentially Displaced Population

This past month, it was my pleasure to do a ride along with Detective Sasee Morales to understand the issues that face the residentially displaced within Sunny Isles Beach. I understand the concerns raised by our residents so I wanted to see what we could do.

Sunny Isles Beach is not alone amongst cities across the country finding it necessary to address this issue more holistically. Unlike some of our neighboring communities, the City of Sunny Isles Beach has a dedicated police detective assigned specifically to this issue. Detective Morales regularly patrols the entire city and makes frequent contact with every residentially displaced person. While she learns of their backgrounds and offers them assistance, very few accept that assistance. She continues to do what she can within the confines of the law, which places limitations on what she can do.

One example of Detective Morales' work is when she helped a young man who was kicked out of his home and was living on our streets due to drug



addiction. For months he refused treatment when offered. However, one day he accepted and broke down in tears thanking Morales for not giving up on him. He is now reunited with his family and has a job. This is just one of many stories that illustrate the proactive measures our department takes to improve everyone's situation.

I believe we could do even more and am supporting the changes needed to assist Detective Morales in her efforts. I will continue to advocate to increase this division to make our community safer for all.



This past February, Interim Police Chief Mike Grandinetti retired after 24 years of service with the SIBPD. DISTRACTED DRIVING

Since April is National Distracted Driving Awareness Month, our Police Department wants to increase awareness of the dangers of distracted driving. According to the Florida Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FHSMV), there were over 56,000 distracted driver crashes in Florida in 2021. When a driver is not focused on the road, it limits their ability to come to a stop and avoid a crash. Whether on the phone or talking to a passenger, distracted driving is unacceptable. The Sunny Isles Beach Police Department will continue to implement a zero-tolerance traffic enforcement policy to keep both drivers and pedestrians safe.

Dune Restoration: A Grassroots Initiative

On February 19, the City hosted two simultaneous dune restoration events in front of Oceania Condominiums and Samson Oceanfront Park, and a beach cleanup at Pier Park. In partnership with Adopt a Dune and the Youth Environmental Alliance at Oceania Beachfront Property, volunteers successfully removed invasive plant species that disrupt the ecosystem of our beach's dunes and replanted native plants. Volunteers also cleaned up debris on land while volunteers from North Miami Squalo Divers cleaned up underwater around the Newport Fishing Pier.

The City donated \$2,500 to the Adopt a Dune organization to assist Oceania with the funding of \$6,000 worth of native plant material. At the event, Mayor Goldman said, "We view this as one of many stops throughout our city to continue to restore the integrity of our beaches. Replanting the dunes is vitally important because it assures the storm surge protection that is so invaluable for our entire coastline and all of our condominiums."

We want to thank all the volunteers for coming out and being a part of the City's #ECOMMITTED effort in maintaining our beaches and natural environment!



For our city, being #ECOMMITTED is not just a phrase or slogan – it's a part of who we are. As a coastal community, we strive to set the standard for others and demonstrate our commitment to being a good steward of our environment. Below are just a few of the ways the City of Sunny Isles Beach takes environmental action and receives recognition for our efforts. We hope you join us in making a brighter, cleaner, and more sustainable future!

Environment Friendly Ordinances

Since 2019, the City has implemented 3 ordinances to protect our beaches, parks, and wildlife.

SKIP THE STRAW

Ordinance 2019-543: The distribution and sale of plastic beverage straws is prohibited in Sunny Isles Beach.

PLEDGE AGAINST POLYSTYRENE

Ordinance 2021-564: The usage or possession of food articles containing expanded polystyrene is prohibited on City property or facilities.

BAN ON BALLOON RELEASES

Ordinance 2022-578: The intentional release of balloons is prohibited anywhere within city limits.

Recognition

In 2021, we were recognized for the 3rd year in a row by Tree City USA for our ongoing commitment to creating and sustaining a network of urban tree cover. The criteria for gaining Tree City USA's designation includes writing a formal policy, financial commitment, and a group



dedicated to caring for trees in the community. We celebrate Tree City USA's recognition annually during our Arbor Day Celebration.

Ways you can be #ECOMMITTED

Sea Turtle Season is April 1 to October 31. Since all sea turtles are either threatened or endangered, conservation efforts are incredibly important. That's why we work closely with the Miami-Dade County Sea Turtle Conservation Program to ensure all nests laid on our beaches are marked off, monitored, and protected. Sea turtles are protected by local, state, and federal laws.

DO YOUR PART TO HELP BY:

- 1 Not touching or disturbing nesting sea turtles or hatchlings.
- Avoiding flashlights or flash photography while on the beach at night.
- 3 Closing your blinds to prevent light from shining onto the beach.
- Filling in holes, disposing of garbage, and clearing a path for hatchlings to make their way to the water.

Course sessions include instruction, conversations, observations, and hands-on activities demonstrating the variety of city services that are provided to residents. Upon completion of this course, participants will:




Understand the operations of the City of Sunny Isles Beach and its relationship to public administration, politics, and the policy process more fully
