A MESSAGE FROM

Stan Morris

As 2022 comes to a close, I want to reflect on our city's great accomplishments this year and take a moment to thank the heroes behind all of the work: our staff.

This year has not always been easy. We faced some roadblocks, trials, and tribulations; but through it all, our city staff stepped up to the plate and always put the city and residents first. Every department played a crucial role in this year's successes, and I want to share a few of their triumphs.

This year more than any other, we prioritized safety on and off the road, with the Police Department at the helm. The effort kicked into gear when we promoted Captain Edward Santiago to Chief of Police. Through additional promotions and hires, the Police Department added ten officers to enhance their presence and visibility on the streets. They reinstated community policing efforts, established a full-time dedicated patrol for the beach and added specialized traffic enforcement units.

This year we celebrated the City's 25th Anniversary. The Cultural and Community Services department did a remarkable job making this celebration special for our residents as we commemorated 25 years of growth and progress in Sunny Isles Beach. The department also

embarked on the tremendous task of creating a Parks and Recreation Master Plan that will take their services to the next level. We will see new developments this coming year with the addition of new parks and park improvements such as new artificial dog turf and new field lights at Senator Gwen Margolis Park.

Maintaining strong financial security has always been a core undertaking for which the Finance Department excels. The department completed the budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year, reducing the city's millage rate while sustaining the strongest reserves in our history. This year, Finance strengthened our procurement processes while also placing a stronger emphasis on sustainable procurement in alignment with our city's core values.

The Building department hosted a Condominium Workshop to inform stakeholders of the possible policy, procedural and protocol changes to the building recertification process to ensure our buildings are designed, constructed and maintained in a safe manner. The department has also been working closely with city

properties to guarantee the proper maintenance and integrity of our buildings.

It has been a busy year for the City Clerk's Office as they managed the special elections in January and February, as well as the General Election in November and the upcoming mayoral runoff election this December.

Human Resources developed a strategy for recruiting and retaining talent during one of the most difficult years for hiring great employees. The department also provided support for the successful recruitment of various Police Department hires and created a hiring bonus to attract new talent. Simultaneously, HR oversaw a comprehensive compensation study that resulted in salary adjustments











for many deserving employees. The IT department is consistently implementing cybersecurity improvements and making progress on the citywide fiber optic network which will benefit our City and residents greatly.

I am thankful for the hard work and dedication of our employees who always maintain the utmost professionalism and proficiency in their expertise. We have made great strides this year and I look forward to all we will accomplish next year. I wish everyone a safe, healthy and happy holidays and New Year.

Our new Police Chief, Eddie Santiago, has worked diligently to increase our police force to levels never achieved before. He has moved our department toward full accreditation, which was never considered important to past administrations. We finally have ongoing traffic enforcement and Sunny Isles Beach is becoming respected as a strict enforcement city to drive through, finally!!

I am proud to say that we are mitigating our street flooding, especially in Golden Shores, and will be adding several new sewers at 18520 North Bay Road and 300 189th Terrace. I am watching and listening to residents for other problem areas to be corrected. We are near completion of the Middle Island New Pump Station design and that will mitigate the flooding problems at North Bay

Things are certainly changing for the better in Sunny Isles Beach. Hopefully after this election on December 6, 2022, we will be able to proceed on course.

PLANNING & ZONING

Our Planning and Zoning department is committed to improving the planned urban fabric of our city. From reviewing site plans and transfer of development rights (TDRs) applications, to conducting site visits and preparing zoning recommendations, the department is efficient, resourceful, and always happy to help.

Planning and Zoning also manages the short-term vacation rental (STR) licensing program. An STR is any unit that is leased or rented for less than six months and are commonly advertised online through platforms such as Airbnb or VRBO. All STRs must be licensed through the City and applications are due annually on September 30 with enforcement going into effect on December 1. The department ensures all STR licenses are in compliance with City ordinances in order to protect the safety of all Sunny Isles Beach residents and visitors.
